The Holiday (2006, 12A)



7th December

"The Holiday" is a romantic comedy where two women, Iris (Kate Winslet) and Amanda (Cameron Diaz), exchange homes for the holidays to escape relationship troubles. In their new settings they find unexpected love and the joy of self-discovery during the festive season.

Bohemian Rhapsody (2018, 12)



4th January

The life of Freddie Mercury (played by Remi Malek), lead singer of British rock band Queen from the formation of the band in 1970 through to their incredible performance at Live Aid in Wembley, 1985. Mercury defies stereotypes and convention to become one of history's most beloved entertainers.

Rebecca (1940, PG)



1st February

This psychological thriller is Hitchcock's first American film. It follows a young woman (Joan Fontaine) who marries a wealthy widower (Laurence Olivier) and moves into his eerie mansion, only to be haunted by the pervasive presence of his deceased first wife, Rebecca, and secrets that threaten her sanity and life.

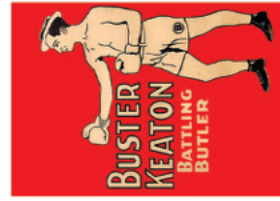
What's Love Got to Do with It (2022, 12A)

Documentary-maker Zoe (Lily James) has been unlucky in love. For Zoe's friend Kaz (Shazad Latif) the answer is an arranged marriage to a bright & beautiful bride from Pakistan. As Zoe films his journey to Lahore to marry a stranger chosen by his parents, she begins to wonder if she might have something to learn.

Yussel (Neil Diamond), a young Jewish cantor forges a musical career outside the synagogue against the wishes of his father (Laurence Olivier) & his loving wife. Growing apart from his family, Yussel travels from New York to LA to play his music but becomes increasingly confused about what he should ultimately do with his life.

It's a Wonderful Life (1946, U)



10th December

One of the great Christmas films, it tells the tale of George Bailey who spends his life giving up on his dreams for the good of his town. When a financial discrepancy breaks George's spirit, an angel is sent from heaven to show him what life would have been like if he had never been born.

Mrs Harris Goes to Paris (2022, PG)



21st January

Widowed cleaning lady Ada falls madly in love with a couture Dior dress in 1950s London. Deciding that she must have one of her own she scrimps and saves her money to pursue her dream, embarking on an adventure to Paris which will change not only her but the very future of the House of Dior.

The Philadelphia Story (1940, U)



25th February

"The Philadelphia Story" is a classic romantic comedy starring Katharine Hepburn, Cary Grant, and James Stewart. It revolves around a high-society wedding and the romantic entanglements of a wealthy socialite, offering wit, charm, and a glimpse into love's complexities among the elite.
